### Text

A 14-year-old girl who was once the face of Akubra– Australia’s famous cowboy-style hat – has taken her own life after being harassed online, prompting calls by her family to “stop the bullies”.

The parents of Amy Everett, who appeared in a popular advertising campaign for Akubra when she was 8, said she was a “caring, beautiful soul” and **they** expressed hope that her death would raise awareness about bullying and harassment. Tick Everett, her father, said in a Facebook post that Amy had taken her life “to escape the evil in this world”. He did not reveal details of the bullying but appealed to those responsible to attend the funeral and witness the complete devastation they have created. “If we can help other precious lives from being lost and the suffering of so many, then Amy's life will not be wasted,” he wrote.

The Akubra Company which has been making **its** trademark wide-rimmed hats for more than a century, released a statement, expressing condolence and denouncing bullying. “We were shocked and distressed to hear of the passing of "Amy". Any type of bullying is unacceptable. It is up to us to stand up when we see any kind of violence.”

Amy’s death resulted in an outpouring of support from friends, family and well-wishers across the country. Surveys in Australia have found about a quarter of students aged 8 to 14 have reported being bullied. “Amy, beautiful girl your death has been a tragedy that we didn't foresee but your death will make changes happen,” said a message on Facebook.
